## SYMBOLIC TEACHINGS OF THE ORDER OF THE EASTERN STAR.

Hostèss at Entrance.

Approaching the Star.

( Hostess continues) This is our Chapter room, but it is not arranged in any sense of the word as it would be for a regular meeting. The efficers have gathered from their various stations and points, into a pattern on the floor, symbolic of the Eastern Star; only the altar and Holy Bible are here; the altar where we take our sacred obligation, and the Hely Bible upon which we draw for much of our ritualistic work; and the principles such as Charity, Truth and Loving Kindness.

What the officers tell you to-might is no part of our ritualistic work. The ritual of the Order will be revealed to you after you assum

the Obligation.

Te Sentimel.

Brother Sentinel, I present to you and to the officers of ......... Chapter, ( name.....), who is eligible for membership in the Eastern Star and wishes to know more about our Order. I would like to have her know the significance of the Sentinel's badge.

Sentinel.

The Sentimel being the first, and guarding the outer gate to our Chapter room smybelines the thought that we must guard our minds and the thoughts that they may be pure. I wear the crossed swords, one sword represents human justice and demands an "eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth" that which often judges without sufficient proof or knowledge of the facts or motives prompting the deed. But the other sword is thrust forward at the gate to keep out that which is unclean. From this we learn that petty spites, hatred and all manner of grievances should the left outside when we enter the Chapter room. Conductress.

The Scroll teaches us that our plans should be carefully and visely made, so that there shall be the greatest good to the largest number and the Exton teaches that these plans should be carried out harmoniously.

Hostess.

The Christian religion is one of music. Our mighty organ peaks forth music which stirs the heart. Brother Organist, what are your thoughts while you play upon your instrument?

Organist.

The Organist teaches that the harmony in our lives reacts upon those arround us. Hasis upon the heart strings brings best service, while discord brings only sorrow and trouble.

You remember Ruth from your childhood daysk I am sure. We have all loved the story of Ruth and Orpha. Sister Ruth, what is your teaching?

Ruth.

Birth teaches unselfish leve. Choose the right path though it may lead to deprivations and poverty; rather than the path of least resistance, as did Orpha, who turned back when her companionship and love were most sorely needed.

Hostess.

As you might suppose, the Secretary of this organization has a very important office. Sister Secretary, why do you wear the crossed pens as jour badge?

Adah.

Electa.

Electa represents the Christian Church, without which the entire world structure would end in utter destruction and chaos by the influence of whit it is hoped all differences will be adjusted and the provised millenium eventually arrive. As Electa stood firm through suffering and stress, so we see through the darkness a certainty for a triumphent living in a victor of right-cousness.

The Warder wears a dove of peace. Sister Warder what is the teaching the Dove of Peace ?.

This station, with its emblem, the Dove of Peace, teaches us to bring all new thoughts into harmony with our ideas of justice. We must not be narrow, biased or prejudiced in our epimions, and love teaches us to receiv oriticism with love, even though it is often unmerited, and to forgive injeven before pardon is asked, and if not asked, to be able to have the grade to say, "Father forgive them, for they know not what they do".

Upon the Treasurer rosts a great responsibility. She has a badge with a surface meaning. Many members have not heard it explained. Sister Treas, what is the interesting meaning of your badge ?

One key is of brass with which to look up the dragon of self-shoess, and the other is the key to the storehouse of love, teaching that we should must pour on others the good we have in store, realising always that seasing to give, we comes to have and enjoy our blessings.

We all know the two sisters, Mary and Martha. Martha is one of the heroines Sister Martha, what do you symbolipe ?

Martha.

Martha symbolises feith in a living God and his promise to man. In this world of seeming chaos may we strive caliantly to carry the trustful faith of our heroine, Martha, until greater revelations of God's wisdom and power open our eyes.

Hostess.

Another means of bringing beauty and dignity into our Chapter room is the play on light. There is a message in light as well as music. Brother electrician, what is the symbolism of light?

Electrician.

The Electrician realizes the important part light plays in life. Light has always symbolized truth and justice. You will see that a pure light whines upon the Bible. That light reflects upon the life of every member of the Order of the Eastern Star.

The Associate Patron shares the duties of the est and together they prepare for their important duties in the tear to come. They face the East, hey face the Star in the East. Their lives are radiant with the reflected light of the Eastern Star.

Sister Associate Matron, what do these colors simily ?

Associate Matron. The Associate Matron strives to mainkin unbroken the tie which unites our Order. These ribbons of color are symbols to you of the uniting force of the principles of the Order of the Eastern Star. As we opened the Star to-night to admit you within, so the Order will open to admit those who wish to make these virtues a ruling force in their lives. The smared ties of the Star will hold us all in matual love.

Brother Associate Patron, what is the message of the double star on your badge?
