At close of Worthy Patron's speech, Marshal escorts new members to position in semicircle west of Altar. As soon as semicircle is formed, Conductress and Associate Conductress, with (or without) lighted candles, take position one at each end of semicircle, and as they do so, Marshal returns to her station. Worthy Matron hands basket to Marshal and speaks:

Sister Marshal, go out in the garden. You will find such lovely things there; We know many flowers are blooming. For their fragrance is filling the air; And we'll put them all here together. That we may all our privileges share.

Marshal receives basket from Worthy Matron. This basket may contain gifts or flowers for new members, or gifts and flowers may be given by Star points. Bibles may be presented, if desired.

Marshal bows, and Star points rise.

Marshal speaks:

If you find in your part of the garden,
A gift you will so gladly share.
Will you bring it that we may together.
Show our friends what they'll find waiting there;
For you can each bring them a message,
From our heroines so noble and true.
That will give to all those who hear it.
A personal interest in you.

Star points with Associate Matron form aisle on north and south of Altar, facing Altar. Marshal passes to these officers in turn and collects gifts or flowers which she places in the basket, after which she presents them to new members as follows:

We cannot bring gifts of great value,
For we have neither silver nor gold;
But what we do give will be cherished,
For it's value to you is untold;
We know through the years you'll be faithful,
And give of your best every day;
And we hope that our welcome will tell you,
We are glad you are going our way.

After gifts are presented, soloist sings:

In our Eastern Star;
We know you will be just as happy as we,
In our Eastern Star;
For we keep the halls ringing, with laughter and singing,
And you have no cause for alarm;
We're not much for show, but you'll love it we know,
