Worthy Matron says: Brother Secretary read the names of the ones who have changed worlds.

Star Points start slowly to the Altar as Margaret begins to sing "He'll understand and say well done." They stand until song is sung then ---

Adah places Blue on the Altar and says: Blue symbolizes fidelity and is placed here in memory of our departed members.

Ruth places Yellow on the Altar and says: Yellow symbolizes constancy and is placed here as a token of loyalty to friends present and friends gone before.

Esther places White upon the Altar and says: White symbolizes purity and is an emblem of purity of the tie that binds us to each other.

Martha places Green upon the Altar and says: Green symbolizes immortality and is an expression of our belief that "there is no death; what seems so is transition".

Electa places Red upon the Altar and says: Red symbolizes fervency and is placed here as a token of our love for those who have changed worlds.

Worthy Matron says: Let us unite in prayer. Chaplain goes to the Altar, gives prayer, rises and she and the Star Points take two steps back and stand until Margaret sings, "There'll be peace in the valley", then all back away, turm and return slowly to their stations.
