Directions: 11119 Co Rd 76, Windsor

For those coming I-25: take I-25 north all the way to the Ft. Collins Harmony exit. Turn right (east) toward Timnath/Severance. Once you reach the 4 way stop sign in Severance (Bruce's Bar will be to your left), turn left (north). You will go one mile. As you approach the top of the hill, you will see a huge red building on your right. You will then cross over the irrigation ditch bridge and you will immediately turn right (east) onto County Road 76. It is the first house on the left (north). The party will be under the big white tent.

If coming up highway 85: you will go through Brighton, Ft. Lupton, Platteville, Gilcrest, LaSalle and Evans. At this point, watch for the exit for Cheyenne north. This will be bypass 85. Stay on bypass 85 until you come to the traffic light in Lucerne. (Highway 392) Turn left (west). Watch for the Severance sign (County Road 23) turn right (north). Once you get to the 4 way stop sign in Severance, (Bruce's bar will be on the NW corner), continue north one more mile. As you approach the top of the hill, you will see a huge red building on your right. You will then cross over the irrigation ditch bridge and immediately turn right (east) onto County Road 76. It is the first house on the left (north). The party will be under the big white tent.

We used to have a lot of entertainment also, I remember 4 ladies dressing as nuns and singing for us, someone had a belly dancer come in and dance for us and found out later she was the daughter of a past Grand Patron. We had people telling stories, we had a chapter that did the story about a lady coming in out of the rain, and one chapter did the ladies Masonic work or as they saw it. Gosh our Elvira group did our pan amine to the Oak Ridge Boys all over Colorado, Utah, New Mexico, Wyoming and any place we were invited and had so much fun doing it. Joan North got us together and we had no idea what a fun time we would have for a number of years. Our last performance was Grand Chapter a year or so ago and we had fun doing it then.

Grand Chapter used to be held downtown at the Consistory and we stayed in hotels down town and car companies would loan us cars for transpiration to hotels for banquets and whatever. We had a lot of fun and the building was always full. I remember one year a WG Patron got a pig from his WG Matron I also remember a WG Matron being installed and just as she stood the zipper on her dress burst and she excused herself and Wende, Sylvia and I pinned her dress together and we went out and was installed.

We had a nurses station under the seats and kept a nurse from Star on had in case we needed one. I remember when Bill Young and Sylvia Webster was setting up for their year, Sylvia wanted items down inside the Altar and John Brunick and I spent the whole afternoon getting that set up, we crawled all over that chapter room getting it just perfect. We had fun but it was a lot of work, we would get it set and move it into position and then have to start all over, but we got it done. Dave Morrison was in charge of the lights and he was a very careful on how he did things and it was done right or else he was not a happy person and I don't think he ever did anything wrong.

The 100th Year Barbara Johnson and Jim Olson had a program and it was more than perfect. They

had three organists play a concert, Marcia Carlson, Joan North and Joyce Holland: I don't remember all the acts but it went way back in years and had several girls do different dances & I remember Virginia and Tom Hurst, Judy and Dave Morrison, Jane and Larry Wullbant, Otis Askren and I all did the Waltz, we women wore full skirt formals with hoops and we had such a good time practicing it at the Hurts basement. I can't remember what else but it was a wonderful evening and the consistory was over flowing with people watching us and giving us encouragement. I think Jim and Joan North was in charge of getting the stage set for the scenes and had lots of help from others. What fun was had by all!

I have been a member 46 years and what a pleasure it has been, I was initiated in Lakewood, but you have all read about that so won't repeat, then moved and joined Hope Chapter for 26 years and now going to Dawn Chapter. I wish so much we could get back those good O'L Days, we had a lot of restrictions, such as going to a Masonic Temple you wore a dress even if it was a practice, all our skirt lengths were long and ½ inch off the floor, we didn't cross our legs on the front row or at our stations all sat like ladies and gentlemen. Men wore Tuxedos. I remember Don wore cowboy boots, (that is all he wore) and was told he should not wear them with a tux, but he said he didn't have anything else so they let it go and now most men wear boots but then most of them don't wear a tux either. Times have changed and not sure it is for the best, my how wonderful the men looked in the tux and ladies in long dresses. We all had to memorize our parts and my first station was Warder and I think my knees made more noise at the door than my wraps. What a scary time it was but I made it and Don was Sentinel and when I would open the door and saw him I would know I was doing okay, I got the door opened and closed with ease.

Well I have rattled on long enough and will close for now but just thought you might like to read about some things I remembered at 2:30AM today. Take care and hope you all come to Grand Chapter, I will be there doing nothing like I like it and looking forward to seeing all of you there, If I don't speak yell at me and lets talk. HELPFUL HINTS TO HELP PREVENT FRAUD



STOP UNWANTED PHONE CALLS, JUNK MAIL & EMAIL

Unwanted telephone calls, emails and third class mail in our mail boxes frustrates many of us on a daily basis. Marketing research tells us that we have to see or hear things at least seven times or more to take action. As a result, we often feel bombarded with ads and information that we are not interested in, but the goal of marketing is to get us to listen, take action, engage, or buy the product or service that is being promoted. There are consumer protections if you don't want these invasions of your privacy.

UNWANTED PHONE CALLS

Colorado Do Not Call List

In 2001, Colorado passed the "Do Not Call" legislation which allows consumers to protect themselves from unwanted telemarketing calls. If you have a cell phone and/or a landline, you must register all phone lines. You may add or remove your residential, wireless, or fax telephone number by calling toll free 800-309-7041 or online at <https://www.coloradonocall.com/default.aspx>. It will take 3-4 months for unwanted calls to stop, after which, you can file a complaint at <https://www.coloradonocall.com/Public/Complaint.aspx> or call our office and we can help file the complaint. If you get calls, you can also remind the caller that you are listed on the Do Not Call list and ask they add your name to the list.

National Do Not Call List

Unfortunately, you will need to register with the National Do Not Call Registry, as the federal government no longer cooperates with the state to automatically add you to the list. Register at <http://www.ftc.gov/donotcall>, or call 1-888-382-1222.

Nonprofits and Political Campaigns Exempt

Nonprofit organizations and political campaigns are exempt and can call regardless if you are listed on the Do Not Call List.

STOP UNWANTED CREDIT CARD/INSURANCE OFFERS

1. UNWANTED US MAIL

Many people get unsolicited credit card offers, insurance opportunities, promotions, and other unsolicited items through the US Mail. If you don't want the mail, leave it "unopened" and mark it

"Return to Sender". If you open mail and don't want it, just put it in the trash (you should shred credit card offers and other sensitive information). If you receive merchandise, you are allowed to keep it without any payment required. It is illegal to send a bill or invoice for unsolicited merchandise.

2. TO OPT OUT OF PRESCREENED OFFERS OF CREDIT AND INSURANCE in the mail, you can choose:

- A. **To opt out for five years:** Go to optoutprescreen.com or call 1-888-5-OPT-OUT (1-888-567-8688). The phone number and website are operated by the major credit bureaus.
- B. **To opt out permanently:** Go to optoutprescreen.com or call 1-888-5-OPT-OUT (1-888-567-8688) to start the process. But to complete your request, you'll need to sign and return the Permanent Opt-Out Election form you'll get after you've started the process.

You can also Register at the Direct Marketing Association's (DMA) consumer website DMAchoice.org, and choose what catalogs, magazine offers, and other mail you want to receive. You'll have to pay a \$2 processing fee, and your registration will last for 10 years. The site also offers the option to stop mail from being sent to someone who's deceased or to a dependent in your care.

Unwanted US Mail Exemptions

1. Free samples which are clearly and conspicuously marked as such.
2. Merchandise mailed by a charitable organization that is soliciting contributions.

STOP UNWANTED EMAIL/SPAM

1. Use a Spam Filter (If you use Google, Hotmail, Yahoo, use the built in features)
2. Mark unwanted mail as Spam or Junk
3. Use more than one email depending on your purpose
4. Unsubscribe to unwanted emails
5. Download updates automatically to avoid malware
6. Change passwords often (make them strong)
7. Unsubscribe to unwanted email
8. Report unwanted email to the sender's email to help them reduce spammers
