MY DAD



As with my Mom, I don't have a favorite memory of my Dad, Brother Owen Miles. He also was always there for me when ever I needed him in anything I did.

Dad did not become a Mason until after I was out of office as Master Councilor in DeMolay. Working for Coors he was not able to be active in

the Lodge as an officer but attended when he could. When I turned 21 (at that time you had to be 21 to petition a Lodge) I gave my Dad my petition for the Lodge. He decided that he wanted to be the Senior Deacon and my Conductor for my First Degree. This he did with no problems as he had a great memory (why I didn't inherit his memory I will never know). When it came time for me to join Eastern Star (South Gate 104) Dad made me wait six months so he would be the Worthy Patron and initiate me along with nine other people that cold snowy night on November 11, 1976. At the time of his death Dad was the most senior Past Patron of South Gate and he was even more senior than any of the Past Matrons of the Chapter. After his death I became the most senior in the Chapter.

Dad was an Illinois farm boy who got to World War II in Europe by taking the Queen Mary over to England. Dad was a survivor of the Battle of the Bulge and received a Purple Heart for wounds he received two months later at the Saar River.

Colorado Law Enforcement Memorial Ceremony CO C.O.P.S. Survivor Luncheon

On Friday, May 6th the "A Musical Journey Grand Family" attended the Colorado Law Enforcement Memorial and the C.O.P.S. survivor luncheon. The events were held at the Colorado State Patrol Academy in Golden on the grounds of Camp George West.



This year, seventeen officers were honored; nine of those officers lost their lives in the line of duty during 2021. Two of the officers were Officer Eric Talley from the Boulder Police Department and Officer Gordon Beesley from the Arvada Police Department. Both of these officers were shot while serving and protecting the citizens of Colorado. The other 2021 officers were James Herrera, Denver Sheriff's Office. Daniel Trujillo, Denver Sheriff's

Office, Eric Scherr, Aurora Police Department, Ty Powell, Windsor Police Department, Clay Livingston Elbert County Sheriff's Office, Joseph Pollack, Douglas County Sheriff's Office and Wayne Weyler, Mesa County Sheriff's Office. All of these officers died as a result of contracting the COVID-19 Virus while serving as Law

Enforcement Officers. The remaining eight were historical officers that were discovered through the research of department histories. The dates of those deaths occurred between 1862 and 2020. These 17 Hero's names were added to the Colorado Law Enforcement Memorial Wall making a total of 342 names currently on the wall. This memorial serves as a reminder that the sacrifice of these hero's will never be forgotten.

The ceremony included presentation of department wreaths, which were placed in front of the Memorial entrance, reading of the proclamation from Governor Jared Polis, a welcome speech from Lt. Col. Barry Bratt of the Colorado State Patrol, as well as a Memorial Address from Cole Finegan - the United States Attorney, District of Colorado. A folded Colorado State flag was presented to each of the surviving families.





The ceremony concluded with Amazing Grace being played by the Colorado Emerald Bagpipe Society members, a 21 gun salute by the Aurora Department Police Honor Guard and Echo Taps played by Sgt. Aaron Murphy from the Arapahoe County SO and Officer Jason Petrocelie from the Aurora PD.



The ending of the ceremony also included a Bald Eagle spreading his wings and being raised into the air for all to see.





After the Ceremony, surviving family members and law enforcement officers from various departments were invited into the gymnasium for a luncheon hosted by the Colorado Chapter of Concerns of Police Survivors (CO C.O.P.S.).

Several members of "A Musical Journey" Grand Family were on hand to help serve the food and drinks, and to assist wherever they were needed. They also assisted with the final cleanup.

WGP-Keith and his escort Shelley, who are also CO C.O.P.S. board members, introduced the Grand Family and spoke about Eastern Star raising funds this year for CO C.O.P.S.

Keith and Shelley wish to thank the Grand Family for attending and helping with the luncheon. It was very much appreciated by all in attendance.

As most of you know the WGP speeches this year have been to honor some of our Colorado Fallen Heros; because of those speeches, it was discovered that PGM, Jane Wullbrandt is a surviving family member. Her father Benjamin Goorman served with the Arapahoe County Sherriff's Office and he died in the line of duty in 1945. Jane and Larry were able to attend the luncheon this year and see her fathers name on the Memorial wall. It was an honor to welcome her after all these years to the CO C.O.P.S. family.

Thank you again, to the Grand Family for your help and to Colorado Eastern Star for your generous donations to the Colorado Concerns of Police Survivors project. Your donations assist with events like these to honor and serve the survivors these Hero's leave behind.
