On April 13, 2001, President George W. Bush said: "For Christians everywhere, Easter is a

need to remember all members of all faiths who are persecuted for their faith.

Another former President said:

"For me, the celebration of Easter puts our earthly concerns into perspective. With humility and with awe, we give thanks to the extraordinary sacrifice of Jesus Christ. We reflect on the brutal pain that He suffered, the scorn that He absorbed, the sins that He bore, this extraordinary gift of salvation that He gave to us. And we try, as best we can, to comprehend the darkness that He endured so that we might receive God's light.

And yet, even as we grapple with the sheer enormity of Jesus's sacrifice, on Easter we can't lose sight of the fact that the story didn't end on Friday. The story keeps on going. On Sunday comes His glorious Resurrection.

"Good Friday may occupy the throne for a day," Dr. King once preached, "but ultimately it must give way to the triumphant beat of the drums of Easter." Drums that beat the rhythm of renewal and redemption, goodness and grace, hope and love. Easter is our affirmation that there are better days ahead – and also a reminder that it is on us, the living, to make them so.

Through God's mercy, Peter the Apostle said, we are given "an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you." It's an inheritance that calls on us to be better, to love more deeply, to serve "the least of these" as an expression of Christ's love here on Earth.

That President said: "I want to quote Dr. King. He says that we should strive "to see the Lord in every excluded person who is thirsty, hungry, naked; to see the Lord present even in those who have lost their faith ... imprisoned, sick, unemployed, persecuted; to see the Lord in the leper – whether in body or soul – who encounters discrimination."

Isn't that how Jesus lived? Isn't that how He loved? Embracing those who were different; serving the marginalized; humbling Himself to the last. This is the example that we are called to follow – to love Him with all our hearts and mind and soul, and to love our neighbors – all of our neighbors – as ourselves. As it says in the first letter of John, "Let

us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth."

Where there is injustice, we defend the oppressed. Where there is disagreement, we treat each other with compassion and respect. Where there are differences, we find strength in our common humanity, knowing that we are all children of God.

So today, we celebrate the magnificent glory of our risen Savior. I pray that we will live up to His example. I pray that we will be strengthened by His eternal love. I pray that we will be worthy of His many blessings." The President who said these words? Then-President Barak Obama at the Easter Prayer Breakfast on April 07, 2015.

I hope each of you have a very happy Easter, and I urge each of you to be kind to our members, and to non-members, to Christians and non-Christians. When we show kindness, we may be able to attract others into this wonderful organization. May our lives of faith and service be a beacon of light to all the world. I urge each of you to bring light into someone else's darkness by showing them the kindness that is in each of us. Be that light of kindness! **Shaven Pavish**, WGM

- Can't find a ride? Ask a friend to carpool. (Conversations during a car ride are priceless)





The Grand Secretary Reported no unusual items for the past month and reminded everyone that the Grand Chapter Session mailing will be going out 1 May. All items must be approved by the WGM/WGP.

The Grand Treasurer reported on the monthly finances, the meeting we had with the financial advisor, Southwest Wealth Advisory Group (SWAG) and answered questions raised in the Finance Committee meeting. The finance committee had questions for the Grand Treasurer which she answered.

As many of you know, the organ used for Grand Session and other events has expired. It is unrepairable. We are looking for a replacement and a digital piano. Marcia Carlson, Musician Emeritus of the Universe, suggested procuring a Digital Piano from a music store that was going out of business. The Grand Secretary checked out the piano and stated it was a very nice piano with a price tag of approximately \$900, but may not be around for much longer. The Worthy Grand Matron informed the BOD that someone approached her and wished to donate the Piano at

no cost to the Grand Chapter. The BOD voted to accept this donation. Additionally, someone has offered to donate a three year old organ to the Grand Chapter with the only cost being moving it.

We are moving ahead with a session contract for 2025 to be held at the Stapleton Doubletree Hotel on Quebec Street. As we said before, negotiations with hotels are not the same as when we had 400 participants and inflation was not eating away at the price and quality of lunches and dinners.

The General Grand Chapter reception was discussed, but the hotel has not yet provided a price for this BOD funded item. . Due to Covid WGM Cheryl, WGP Keith, WGM Beth, WGP Gary did not have the opportunity to attend a General Grand Chapter Session. Much discussion ensued regarding our current Bylaws. It was moved the BOD pay for these four positions along with what our current bylaws require. This motion carried. We will also create an amendment to bring our bylaws into compliance with the rotation of the GGC. That is, the WGMs and WGPs who serve in/during a General Grand Chapter will have their airfare paid to that GGC Session. There was discussion regarding the language in our three funds, George Monroe, ESTARL and Iva Mae Ryan. There will probably be amendments brought forth regarding the language in our bylaws. We are working on an on-line Warrant Approval work flow to comply with our bylaws.

The 2024-2025 budget continues to be refined. And may be affected by changes to our bylaws if the membership chooses to change our bylaws at Grand Session.






