For many thousands of years until the discovery of electricity, and our brilliantly illuminated cities, the thoughts of men went out toward the stars. The ancient study of stars led to our first science - astrology - which led the world to the study of astronomy. . . just as the study of alchemy led to the knowledge of chemistry.

Augustus was sitting on the throne of the Roman Empire. One of his favorite occupations was to compile a register of populations and revenues of his vast dominions. According to Jewish custom the census was taken, not at the center of your residence, but at the place or center to which you belonged as members of one of the original twelve tribes.
