Five sisters (these may be the Star Points if necessary) dressed in old fashioned costumes if at all possible, enter through the Chapter room door. Each carries a lighted candle the color of a Star Point. They advance in one line to Associate Matron's station, then turn East to Esther's station. The line then divides, the first going to Adah's station, second to Electa's, third to Ruth's, fourth to Martha's and fifth to Esther's. They stand beside these stations outside the labyrinth. As each sister speaks she advances to the Altar and places her candle on it, then remains there.

Adah:

Our past matrons and patrons had the spirit of pioneers, And with the fidelity of Adah carried on without doubt or fears Because of their convictions they were so very true Upon the Altar we will place this candle of the blue.

Ruth:

Our past matrons and past patrons like the pioneer of old, Had the constancy of Ruth, in courage were strong and bold. Because they served unselfishly and humbly day by day Upon the Altar we will place the lovely yellow ray.

Esther:

These officers were ready any sacrifice to make, When a duty called them, for the Chapter's sake, Because they served so joyously in the cause of right Upon the Altar we will place the pure ray of white.

Martha:

Our past matrons and patrons had faith in our great cause, And followed in the paths of right without a single pause. Upon the Altar we will place this candle of faith's green Because they shed its rays afar that by others it was seen.

Electa:

In the spirit of Electa's love we honor these guests tonight, As we pay them these tributes which are truly theirs by right. Upon the Altar now we place this red light of love, And wish for them many blessings from the Father in Heaven above.

The sisters all bow. Music - A Carland of Old Fashioned Roses is sung.

While this is sung the sister representing Electa may present each past matron and patron with a red rose or a small gift from the Chapter, although this will not be necessary. At the close of the song the sisters retire led by the sister representing Adah.

This ends the ceremony.
