Queen Esther Saves Her People (The Story of Purim)

I thought it would be great to learn more about the heroines of the Eastern Star and what were the actual circumstances in their lives that they dealt with so heroically. Coming soon will be the jolly Jewish holiday of Purim which is celebrated every year on the 14th of the Hebrew month of Adar (late winter/early spring). This year Purim 2022 begins on Wednesday night, March 16 and continues through Thursday, March 17. This brings us to the 3rd point of our Eastern Star exemplified by Queen Esther, the heroine of the Purim story. She is first recognized in the Scroll, or Megillah (book) of Esther in the Hebrew Bible the same as the Book of Esther in the Christian Old Testament. It commemorates the salvation of the Jewish people in the ancient Persian empire (current day Iran) around the year 357 BCE - the 4th Century Before the Common Era.


Basic story: King Ahasuerus was king of the Persian Empire, he's better known to us today, as Xerxes, or as Khshayārshā in the old Persian inscriptions. At this time the Persian Empire was very large and encompassed many different peoples. As long as these peoples did not pose a threat to his Empire, Xerxes was somewhat tolerant to their diversity. He was, however, the Supreme Ruler and expected all of his subjects to obey him. After King Xerxes had his wife, Vashti, executed for defying him, he arranged a beauty pageant to find a new queen.



A Jewish girl, Esther, found great favor in the eyes of the king, who married her, unaware of her religious background. The story is that he fell deeply in love with her. Although beautiful, she was a very dutiful and supportive wife.

Sometime around 375 BCE, a new prime minister of the Persian empire was appointed, an

official by the name of Haman. Haman's family had pursued a vendetta against the Jewish people since the time of King Saul. Haman was very proud and expected deference from everyone, except the King. However, Mordechai, the leader of the Jews (and Esther's cousin) refused to bow



down to Haman. This enraged Haman and his wife. Without the knowledge of the King, they came up with a plot to falsely convince the King that all Jewish

people in the 127 lands which then made-up Persia were a threat to the Empire. Citing false security issues, Haman convinced the king to issue a decree ordering the extermination of all the Jews, *"to destroy, kill and annihilate all the Jews, youth and old, infants and women, in a single day"*. This was to occur on the 13th of the month Adar, a date Haman chose by the casting of lots.

Mordechai sent out warnings to all the Jewish communities to prepare. Meanwhile, Esther risked her exalted position and even death, by breaking royal protocol and entering the presence of the King without his royal permission. When the King recognized her, Esther requested the King and Haman join her for a special feast. At the feast, Esther revealed



to the King her Jewish identity, Haman's nefarious scheme, and requested the King's help for his loyal Jewish subjects. Xerxes was angered that Haman had lied to him and tried to manipulate him into killing his Jewish subjects. As a

result, Haman was hanged, and Mordechai was appointed prime minister in his place. Because Persian Law at the time did not allow the King to rescind a Royal Decree, Xerxes issued a new

decree granting the Jews the right to defend themselves if attacked. On the 13th of Adar, the Jews mobilized and killed any enemies who attacked them. On the 14th of Adar, the Jews rested and celebrated.

Purim means "lots" in ancient Persian as in the casting of lots. Purim was therefore adopted by the Jewish people as the holiday's name. Purim can be pronounced many ways. In Eastern tradition, it is called poo-REEM. Among Westerners, it is often PUH-rim. When Jews greet each on the joyous holiday of Purim, they say "Happy Purim" or "Chag Purim Sameach" (KHAG poo-REEM say-MAY-akh) in Hebrew.

How is Purim celebrated today?

First is the reading of the Megillah or the book/scroll of Esther which retells the story of Purim both on the eve of Purim and then again on the following day. Hand noisemakers,



called "Graggers" - are twirled and used to block out Haman's name anytime it's spoken. However, anything that makes a loud noise can be used, and in

some services people stamp their feet loudly instead. I remember one Synagogue Purim service when the Cantor loudly blew his trumpet every time Haman's name was spoken. That was one rowdy and fun filled Purim celebration.

There is a spirit of liveliness, joy and fun on Purim that is not seen anywhere else on the Jewish calendar. It is a day to "let loose", and just be Jewish. It is a "Carnival" time. It is also customary for children and adults to dress up in costumes and celebrate with festive booths for



the children. It is traditional to give money gifts to at least two poor persons. Another tradition is to send gifts of two kinds of food to at least one person, but more often, lavishly wrapped baskets of food are sent to charitable organizations.

And of course, there is a festive Purim feast (*seudah*) which unlike most Jewish feasts, often includes plentiful wine or other intoxicating beverages, and many rich foods. A traditional Purim food is *hamantaschen* (or *oznei Haman*




meaning "Haman's ears"), three-cornered cookies or pastries bursting with poppy seeds or another sweet filling; now frequently stuffed with every kind of jam, chocolate, nuts, and even various savory fillings. (My favorite is chocolate and nut filled

hamantaschen.) Jews of Syrian, Lebanese, and Egyptian descent eat cookies called *Ma'amoul* which means "filled" in Arabic. These tender cookies are filled with all sorts of delights, like dates or nuts or other sweets. Pistachios and walnuts are popular Purim fillings.

So now you know about the Jewish holiday of Purim, the celebration of Esther's heroism, and unselfish dedication to justice and the welfare of others.





NEW GRAND REPRESENTATIVE APPOINTMENTS

AREME Chapter, hosting the "A Musical Journey" Grand Family for their Official Visit, gave WGM Cheryl Williams the opportunity to not only surprise this newest appointment, but also WGP Keith, when she commissioned his wife, **Shelley Hoey, as Grand Representative of Nova Scotia & Prince Edward Island.**

Nova Scotia, Latin for "New Scotland" is the second smallest province of Canada in terms of land area and population. As of December 2021, the province of Nova Scotia reached 1 million in population and is the most populous of Canada's Atlantic provinces. The province of Nova Scotia is a peninsula connected to the mainland of North America by the Isthmus of Chignecto, on which the province land borders with New Brunswick. Its other borders are the Bay of Fundy and Gulf of Maine to the West, the Atlantic Ocean to the south and east, and is separated from Prince Edward Island and the island of Newfoundland by the Northumberland and Cabot straits, respectively. Nova Scotia's largest city is Halifax, which is also the capital and is home to 45 percent of the province's population. The province has 87 National Historic Sites of Canada, including the Habitation at Port-Royal, the Fortress of Louisbourg and Citadel Hill (Fort George) in Halifax. Nova Scotia has two national parks, Kejimikujik and Cape Breton Highlands, and many other protected areas. The Bay of Fundy has the highest tidal range in the world, and the iconic Peggys Point Lighthouse in Peggys Cove is internationally recognized and receives 600,000-plus visitors a year and is the most famous of the 160 lighthouses of Nova Scotia.

Prince Edward Island is the smallest province in terms of land area and population, but the most densely populated. The island has several nicknames: "Garden of the Gulf", "Birthplace of Confederation" and "Cradle of Confederation". Its capital and largest city is Charlottetown. Prince Edward Island is located in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, about 120 miles north of Halifax, Nova Scotia and 370 miles east of Quebec City. It is the 104th-largest island in the world and Canada's 23rd-largest island. There are 56 lighthouses on Prince Edward Island

Lucy Maud Montgomery, who was born in Clifton (now New London) in 1874, drew inspiration

from the land during the late Victorian Era for the setting of her classic novel *Anne of Green Gables* (1908). The musical play *Anne of Green Gables* has run every year at the Charlottetown festival for more than four decades. The sequel, *Anne & Gilbert*, premiered in the Playhouse in Victoria in 2005. The actual location of Green Gables, the house featured in Montgomery's *Anne* books, is in Cavendish, on the north shore of PEI.

"Music, Dance and Laughter" is the Theme for this Eastern Star Grand Chapter Year. The Session will be held July 3-6, 2022, at the Best Western Glengary Convention Centre, Truro, Nova Scotia where WGM Beth Lois Brett and Worthy Grand Patron Shane MacFarlane will preside. The rush for statehood prior to the election was to help ensure Abraham Lincoln's reelection on November 8. As it turned out, Lincoln and the Republicans won the election handily and did not need Nevada's help.

While the biggest attraction in Nevada is Las Vegas with its sparkling lights, casinos, gourmet dining and shows, there are many other things to see and do in Nevada. Hoover Dam, Fly Geyser, Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area, Valley of Fire State Park, Lake Tahoe and the
