


I hope to see all of you, if not at the session, then as Sister Beth and Brother Gary travel on their many journeys.





Thanks to a generous donation from sister Dessie Marie Powell upon her passing, Colorado Chapter #2 was able to establish fund in her name to honor all the teachers who were members of #2. The first scholarship was awarded in 2006 at Lake County High School (LCHS).

Fast forward to 2012 when LCHS and Colorado Mountain College (CMC) awarded degrees to William Mundo. He had entered our school system as a First Generation American (FGA), knowing no english as a pre-schooler with a tough road to travel. Upon graduation, William earned several scholarships including the Dessie Powell and Gary Baker award presented by Corinthian Lodge #35.

Where would he go from here? He attended the University of Colorado at Denver receiving a Bachelor of Science in public health and a Bachelor of Arts in ethnic studies. He also received a Master's degree from Colorado School of Public Health. Along his journey he mentored many First Generation Americans so they would not loose sight of their goals.

Now in 2022, he is a graduate of University of Colorado School of Medicine and is Dr. Mundo, MD. He has been matched with the University of Colorado Hospital and Denver Health working in emergency medicine. Our members were able to attend an event at CMC honoring Dr. Mundo and his family.

#### **ZUCCHINI TOTS**

2 medium zucchini (12 oz.)

1 large egg
1/2 c. grated pecorino
1 clove garliclic, crushed with press
1/2 tsp. black pepper

Preheat oven to 400°F. Coat one large baking sheet with nonstick cooking spray. Shred zucchini and squeeze dry with paper towels. Mix shredded zucchini with egg, pecorino, panko, garlic, and pepper.

Using a small cookie scoop, drop tablespoonfuls of mixture onto prepared baking sheet. Then, shape each into a small log. Bake in 400°F oven, turning halfway through, until golden brown, 20 to 22 minutes.






