Welcome speech for Worthy Matron:

How fitting that the great lesson of love should come to us from Electa, the mother's point of our Star, for Electa represents the mother of all mankind, and there is no earthly love greater than a mother's love.

Star points and Assoc. Matron form circle around Altar by stepping within labyrinth, Electa taking position east of Altar. Associate Matron carries basket, and Star points, with exception of Electa, carry white and red (or colored) flowers. Other officers may join in circle around Altar if desired.

Associate Matron speaks:

The flowers we bring have a fragrance so sweet, They've been kissed by the fresh morning dew, They've been tinted in colors no artist could paint, They are speaking so silently too.

They tell of a love of a mother so dear,
The love of your mother and mine,
The love that is greater than all else to us,
It has stood through the ages of time.

To Electa we give the flowers we hold, For her's is the Star point of love; And with them will come her message to you, Of the love of the Father above.

Associate Matron gathers the flowers from the Star points, places them in her basket, and gives them to Electa. As soon as Electa has received the flowers, officers return to stations.

Electa approaches the East, and beginning with Worthy Matron, she passes around room, giving colored flowers to those who have living mothers, and white flowers to those whose mothers have passed to the Great Beyond.

The following song may be sung while officers are around Altar, or as Electa passes the flowers:

Tune: "Near The Cross." (Hymn)

We bring flowers of love today, Flowers full of beauty, Flowers which clearly say to us That each has a duty.

Chorus. Flowers tell, all too well,
That there is no other
Earthly love so good and true
As the love of mother.

Lessons teach us that we must Always love each other, For love is the greatest gift We can give another.

Mother's love is always true Long as life is given, So wear flowers for her today, Living or in Heaven.

## Repeat Chorus:

After flowers are presented, Electa returns to station.
