Guidelines for Electronic Files Submitted to the 4-U-2 Review our articles, photos, and advertiseme

We welcome your articles, photos, and advertisements in the 4-U-2 Review. In order to effectively utilize your electronic submissions, it is requested that you follow these guidelines:

- 1) Articles submitted via email or disk are saved as a Microsoft Word Doc. Otherwise save as a text file. If saving on a Mac, use a save for PC option or make sure the three letter extension is saved on it. (i.e. 'myarticle.txt' or 'myarticle.doc')
- 2) Photographs submitted electronically must be saved as 'Tiffs' (.tif) or 'Jpegs' (.jpg) for PCs. Tiffs ensure higher quality of photo. However, neither format will be good unless the resolution is at least 300 dpi. Most digital cameras make Jpegs on memory cards at 72 dpi but they are large (ex. 15inches by 20inches). You need to do an image re-size (or cropping) by increasing the dpi and decreasing the photo size (around 5"x6.5" range). Your finished photo will be a large file. That's okay.

Dear Sisters & Brothers:

I am excited & honored to have served as the Chairperson for our spirits in Harmony WGM's beneficent project benefitting pediatric cancer in Colorado. This project is near and dear to our WGM's heart as she knows first-hand what it is like to be a pediatric patient. Sister Lynda and I had the pleasure of touring the Children's Hospital campus in Aurora, CO to learn more about the hospital's mission. What an amazing operation! No child is denied care at this worldrenowned facility. They care for children from all 50 states and 36 countries. The care team, comprised of doctors, nurses, social workers, family navigators, chaplains and childhood specialists, do everything they can to help their young patients and their families feel cared for and comfortable during a difficult time. The Aurora campus has an in-house radio station donated by Ryan Seacrest, daily arts and crafts, classrooms, healing garden, birthday a celebrations, visits from sports celebrities, canine companions and so much more.

I would like to tell you about YAPS, one of the special programs established at Children's Hospital to support the children in the oncology department, and our WGM's project for 2018-19. The Youth and Pet Survivor program, or "YAPS" for short, is a pen pal program that pairs pediatric oncology patients with dogs and cats who have survived cancer or other serious medical conditions. Children and pets (via their owners) establish relationships and communicate through letter writing. This allows children the unique opportunity to share feelings about having cancer with a safe, unconditionally loving animal. YAPS child participants report enhanced well-being; YAPS pet owners report a sense of contribution knowing that their pet's illness can make a difference in a child's life.

Our WGM's goal this year was to raise \$5,000, or \$150 per chapter. To help do so, two statewide fundraisers were planned: Dine-to-Donate (February) and Change for Good (April) (cont'd p 7)

This group has a compound in Buena Vista where special needs children and adults can benefit from interaction with miniature horses. The horses also visit schools, nursing homes and hospitals. Sr. Judy Epperson, #2's Conductress, is a leader for this group.

After many years of planning, Sr. Betty Roeder and her records committee have reorganized, sorted, and rearranged the records, souvenirs, and other miscellany which came from the affiliations of Eagle #86 and Erica #69 with Colorado #2. We were very happy to donate the altar, pedestals and emblems, as well as chair backs and other decorations to the new Peace and Harmony Chapter at Pagosa Springs.

The Chapter has joined with the brethren of Corinthian #35 to sponsor a half page ad in the high school activities programs, the summertime flower baskets outside the door, and the Masonic Band Camp.

The most recent project was the wreath sales which, when all charges have been paid, will bring #2 a \$3,700 profit.
