Marshal takes position between Altar and dais, bows, and Star points rise.

Marshal speaks:

Sister Ruth: Your point receives it's color from the yellow jessamine.

Her kindreds lives to save;
She has the color of pure white,
For she was true and brave.

Sister Martha: Your point receives it's color from the green fern.

She has the gift of love.

Sister Electa: Your point receives it's color from the red rose.
Electa claims the color red,
Because of charity;
Of all her virtues be it said,
She helps humanity.

After colors are presented, Marshal passes back of Star points, taking former position between dais and Altar.

Marshal speaks: The blue, the yellow, white and green,
With red so lovely too,
Are colors that are so serene,
Teaching their lessons true.

For Adah, Ruth, and Esther too,
Like Martha always fair,
We find Electa ever true,
Her charity to share.

So as you try to teach each day,
The lessons all so dear,
May you lead others on the way,
And fill each heart with cheer.
