The Rob Morris Memorial is a historical landmark located in LaGrange, Kentucky in the heart of Oldham County. Dr. Robert Morris, founder of the Order of the Eastern Star, lived in this home from 1860 until his death in 1888. He moved to LaGrange to serve as president of the Masonic College. Items displayed in the Morris home include original furnishings, some personal belongings, and souvenirs of his travels throughout the world.

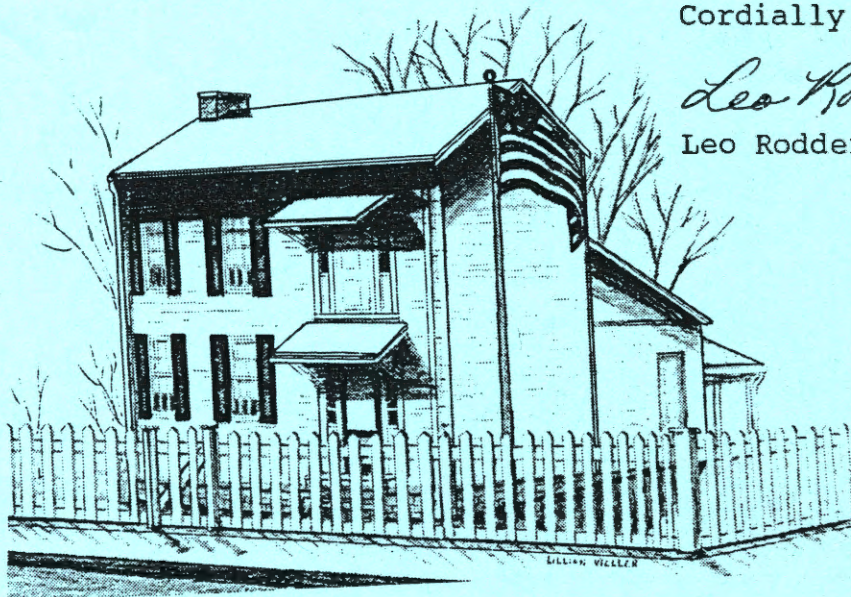
